

Creative Curriculum Topic: Fire, Gunpowder, Treason and Plot.



 <p><b>Literacy</b> As writers, we will look at Traditional Tales: The Three Little Pigs and Hansel and Gretel. They will use these to develop their own characters and stories. We will use non-fiction texts about The Great Fire and Bonfire night to write instructions and leaflets. We will also look at a mixture of poetry to recite and use to write our own.</p>	 <p><b>Numeracy</b> As mathematicians, we will be looking at place value, addition, subtraction, Multiplication, division, shape and money. The children will apply their number and reasoning skills through completing word number problems. They will also focus on the following times tables: 2, 5 and 10.</p>	 <p><b>Science</b> As scientists, we are exploring the topic 'Animals, including humans'. The children will learn how animals grow and change and discover their life cycles. They will also learn about the different types of animals and the habitats they live in and what all animals, including humans need to survive.</p>	 <p><b>Computing</b> As computer users, we will be learning how to use technology purposefully to create, organise, store, manipulate and retrieve digital content. The children will also be learning how to use a variety of computer programs such as code.org and how to log off or shut down the computer independently.</p>
 <p><b>History</b> As a historian, we will look at the life and events of Guy Fawkes and his relevance to modern day times. We will also discover what happened in the 'Great Fire of London'. We will cover Remembrance Day and highlight to the children the importance of this event.</p>	 <p><b>Geography</b> During the second half-term, our topic is 'British Isles'. The children will be learning about capital cities and key locations. They will Use aerial photographs to recognise landmarks; human and physical features and identify surrounding seas.</p>	 <p><b>Art</b> As an artist, we will be looking at Bonfire Art – The children will explore warm and cold colours and use the work of Kandinsky to inspire firework night paintings. The children will also take part in Christmas activities.</p>	 <p><b>D&amp;T</b> As a designer, we will be designing and making a fire engine with an axle, wheel and chassis. The children will learn how to design and make changes to improve their product. We will also be creating our own Christmas cards.</p>
 <p><b>Music</b> As a musician, we will be listening to a variety of pieces of music and discussing how it makes us feel. We will also be re-creating the plot of the Great Fire using instruments.</p>	 <p><b>PE</b> This term in PE we will be taking part in distanced fitness sessions, involving running, jumping and throwing. We will also learn the skills of hitting and catching.</p>	 <p><b>RE</b> As a theologian, we will be looking at the theme of 'How should we care for the world?' The children will listen to different stories from the bible and we will celebrate festivals like Harvest and Christmas.</p>	 <p><b>PSHE</b> As speakers, we will be looking at well-being and mindfulness. This involves emotional well-being, and we will understand how we change and develop over time. We will discuss events in the world around us at the moment and how this makes us feel.</p>
